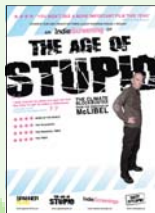

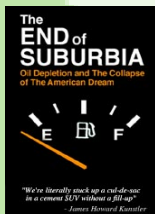

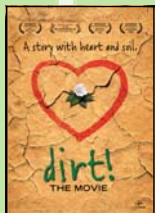


The End of Suburbia

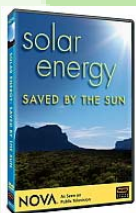


The Story of Stuff

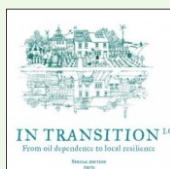

Transition Towns Albury-Wodonga

Transition is a worldwide movement of local communities building resilience in response to the future challenges of peak oil and climate change. Transition Towns Albury Wodonga was conceived in late 2009 by a group of local citizens from both Albury and Wodonga to kick start the discussion on planning for a better future in which we are less reliant on uncertain imported fossil fuel supplies and at the same time reduce our carbon footprint and prepare to adapt to a changing local climate.

We see the future as a brimming with potential opportunities that can help create a resilient community that can cope with the external shocks that may be thrust upon us. At the same time we can build economic, social and environmental capital which is focussed on our local sustainable resources including energy, water, agriculture and people.

Transition Towns is a co-coordinating and support umbrella for community initiatives and projects. It is anticipated that 2010 will see the formation of a formal committee to steer the transition process forward.
